A-TSLSPU (2pt hanger bar)



Part Number	Size	Max Load
A-TSLSPU	45"W x 86"L	454kg / 1000lb
A-TSLSPUX	55"W x 86"L	500kg / 1100lb

- If needed, a chuck may be placed between patient and sling.
- Label should be at patient's foot.
- Pillow may be placed between legs for comfort.

NOTE: The attachment configurations shown are a general guideline. Please adhere to your hospital's policy and use your clinical judgment as to what best meets your patient's needs.

USING THE TSL TO TURN PATIENT

Attach two straps closest to patient's middle area: close to patient's shoulder and hip

A-TSLSPU (2pt hanger bar)

SUPINE TRANSFER

Generally use the same length loop all the way down



SEMI-RECLINED TRANSFER

Generally use the short loop for strap 1 and the longer loop for the rest of the straps to keep the patient in a semi-reclined position. Strap 3 may or may not be needed depending on the patient's body habitus.



Cleaning Instructions

• DO NOT LAUNDER - may be spot cleaned with hot water if soiled by patient.

DISCLAIMERS

- Discontinue use if loose stitching or tears are visible.
- Do not use with an uncleared C-Spine.
